Haiti

A new story for Haiti.



On 12 January 2010, a devastating 7.0 earthquake in Haiti left more than 1.5 million people homeless. In just 30 seconds, much of the country's housing and infrastructure was reduced to rubble. Since that day, a story of survival and perseverance has unfolded. Thanks to your support, Habitat for Humanity has helped more than 265,000 Haitians rebuild their lives.

We have been involved with the recovery since the very beginning. Within days, our Emergency Response Programme went into operation, constructing transitional and upgradable shelters, delivering more than 24,000 emergency

shelter kits with partner organisations and repairing damaged housing.

Santo is a small village in the Croix-des-Bouquets region of Haiti which was next to the epicentre of the earthquake. This community was in desperate need. Now, there are 300 permanent homes in Santo built by volunteers, local workers and families.

We are delighted to announce our new partnership with planning experts, Albright Dene, who will support the construction of a minimum of 22 homes in Malawi. Albright Dene offer unique and innovative planning solutions to help homeowners and investors develop their properties, and they are thrilled to be working with us on this project.

The support will go to two communities in Salima and Mulanje to build new homes for orphans and vulnerable children, an initiative which will dramatically improve their living conditions and reduce their vulnerability. Malawi is one of the poorest countries in the world, so Albright Dene's fantastic support is especially appreciated and needed by these 110 children and their caregivers.

We are also thrilled that Managing Director, Joe McDermott, will visit Malawi in May, to see the construction of the first three houses!

Global Programmes

Our work around the world continues to make a life changing impact, helping more and more communities to build themselves a pathway out of poverty. On this page you'll read about just a few of the amazing projects that we have delivered in the past year.

1 Brazil

We have been supporting HFH Brazil since 2011 to deliver a land rights project in Recife. Restrictive land title laws in the country often mean that families cannot get loans to improve the safety and quality of their homes. Our project, which we completed in March in collaboration with UKAID, has enabled 2,500 families to secure the rights to their land. As part of the process, Habitat met with all 20 municipal judges to discuss ways to improve the existing legal process, prompting a commitment to speed up land regulations and laying the foundations for countless more to benefit.

2 Cambodia

Since 2013, the 'New Start, New Life' project in Phnom Penh has impacted 770 people, with the aim of impacting another 250 by the end of 2015. Funded by Towerbrook and the Jersey Overseas Aid Commission, the project helps families living with HIV/AIDS to improve their homes as well as providing livelihood training. Beneficiaries have told us that they now have hope because their new homes have provided a secure base from which to start a small business and send their children to school.

3 Lebanon

Working in partnership with HFH Lebanon, we began a project in 2013 which provides home improvement loans to vulnerable households across the country. Supported by Embrace the Middle East, the project has enabled the upgrade of water and sanitation facilities as well as living conditions. We are also supporting a pilot project in the Bekaa Valley to improve the water supplies in Syrian refugee camps.



4 Philippines

The people of the Philippines have been victim to a series of disasters over the past 18 months. The Bohol earthquake in October 2013 was followed by Super-Typhoon Haiyan in November 2013 and a number of other smaller tropical storms throughout 2014. We have raised in excess of £1.1 million to support HFH Philippines with their response, recovery and rebuild efforts across the country, focusing on those least able to self-recover: the elderly infirm, disabled and people with poor health. Your support has changed lives in this nation.

JAMIE'S FARM

CHANGING CULTIVATING

Habitat for Humanity are hard at work in Great Britain. One of our many 2015 projects is Waterloo Farm: a small educational working farm in the heart of Lambeth. This exciting project, in partnership with the Oasis Trust, is projected to reach 2,000 children and adults in its first year of operation and will provide educational opportunities for the local community. The main beneficiaries will be three local schools who will be able to use the farm for educational and behavioural awareness sessions for children.

Once built, the farm will work in partnership with Jamie's Farm and be renamed **Oasis Farm: Waterloo**. Jamie's Farm uses farm based therapy to give children space to reflect and determine a new path for themselves. Their confidence, self-respect and empathy are all improved through working with animals.

Our volunteers are working hard to build this farm ready for its opening in September 2015.

When completed the farm will feature a barn, washing facilities, animal pens, gardening beds, a classroom and more. The farm will eventually grow fruit and vegetables and rear livestock such as chickens, lambs and pigs which will be brought to the site for short periods of time*.

Volunteer teams of 5 to 10 people a day are welcome until August 2015 and will be fully supported by experienced Habitat staff. A donation of £100 will cover the costs for everything from hard hats to lunch, so all you have to do is turn up!

The Red Roofs of Mfuleni, Part 1

Paul Williams and his family have supported Habitat for Humanity for many years and in many ways. He was even kind enough, when we interrupted his holiday in the Arctic Circle, to answer a few questions about one particular South African town where he has seen Habitat make a huge difference.

How did you get involved in Mfuleni?

We went to a friend's wedding in South Africa. Cape Town and the stunning landscape lived up to my expectations, but I wasn't prepared for the sprawl of shacks flanking the 10-mile road from the airport to the city, where thousands of families lived in unimaginable poverty.

A year later, I saw a flyer for Habitat for Humanity, looking for volunteers to build houses in Mfuleni, close to that road between Cape Town airport and the city! Here was an opportunity to make a difference to that scene I had witnessed.

What struck you about what you saw in Mfuleni?

We saw a bustling community: hair salons and playgroups in shipping containers, market stalls selling sheep's heads and people getting on with their lives. But the township was dominated by ramshackle sheds made of broken wood, corrugated iron and plastic that most families were using as their homes.

You've seen the development of Mfuleni over many years. What would you say has been the greatest impact of Habitat's work in the area?

If you zoom in on Cape Town on Google Earth, you can see the grey mass of shack towns around the city, but if you navigate to Mfuleni you can see an orange mass – a sea of red roofs – and as you go closer you can see the individual houses that Habitat for Humanity have built. It is incredible to see how the work has spread.
