MEET THE FUNDRAISERS

Martin and Liz Howden have raised almost £35,000 to provide safe and decent housing in Ethiopia. Martin is a leading Executive Coach and has donated all of the proceeds from the sales of his self-coaching books 'This Stuff Really Works' and 'Courage to Change'. Liz is a complementary therapist and has donated all the tips she has received from her clients over the last few years.

HOW DID YOU FIRST GET INVOLVED WITH ETHIOPIA?


Since 2004 we have both been self-employed and were able to use this flexibility to go on a Global Village trip to Dessie, Ethiopia in early 2005. Building on that initial experience we have since been back to Ethiopia several times, both to participate in further GV trips and in Martin's case to undertake management coaching with a wide range of leaders of development charities in the country.

WHY ETHIOPIA?

Going back a year or two, Liz was fascinated by Ethiopia in her school geography lessons. Whilst this led to our initial contact, Ethiopia and Ethiopians worked their way into our affections. We love the country and its people.

WHY DO YOU THINK HABITAT'S MODEL REALLY WORKS?

We love the focus of the Habitat model. Over many years, Habitat has built a huge amount of experience in provision of safe and decent housing, which has equipped them to deal with a huge spectrum of issues. It is also a "self-help" and sustainable model. In the vast majority of cases the home owners repay their loans in full, thereby taking ownership of their homes and releasing the loan to provide housing for another family.



WHAT DIFFERENCE HAS THE MONEY YOU HAVE RAISED MADE IN ETHIOPIA?

The first £27,000 we raised has been matched by other donors meaning Habitat have been able to launch a project to build an initial 34 homes in a region called Bisidimo, to re-house families affected by leprosy. This first phase should be completed in 2015. Given a successful first phase we then hope to move to a second phase with a further substantial tranche of housing. Our current fundraising is in preparation for this second phase.

ARE THERE OPPORTUNITIES FOR PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT BY SUPPORTING HABITAT?

Our first Global Village trip to Ethiopia changed our lives by giving us an awareness of life in one of the 10 poorest countries on earth in a way that we would never have gained by staying at home. People do different things with that new awareness, but we strongly believe that it brings with it a responsibility. In our case it has led to a deeper understanding of the role that accident of birth plays in our lives, our world-view and our wider thinking. It has also led to an awareness of the vital difference between empowerment and charity and how those two approaches impact the dignity of under-privileged people anywhere in the world, including in our own country.

Known as the 'roof of Africa' because its lowest point is still over 3,000 ft above sea level, Lesotho is mountainous country, geographically enclosed by South Africa. Habitat for Humanity has been working there since 2001 not only to provide roofs, but security, dignity and hope to orphans, vulnerable children and their families.

We focus support on this special group of beneficiaries in response to the immense need within the country. Lesotho has the third highest prevalence of HIV and AIDS in the world. The devastating impact of disease, extreme poverty and food insecurity have orphaned more than 220,000 children. Having lost one or both parents, huge numbers of children are abandoned or find themselves in the care of another child, or an elderly or infirm guardian.

They are children like 13 year old Tumisang and his 10 year old brother Motlalepula. Five months ago, the boys were living in cramped and unsanitary conditions with their grandmother, cousins Tsepo and Relebohile and Relebohile's own six month old baby. The pitiful shelter wasn't even theirs and they lived with the constant fear of eviction.

Happily, Tumisang's family now wake up in their own newly built two-room house. Unlike 40% of people living in Lesotho who are forced to use open spaces or 'flying toilets' (otherwise known as plastic bags), they also have a sanitary and properly ventilated pit latrine. Their health is further protected by access to safe drinking water and the training they have received on house maintenance and hygiene.

Our work in Lesotho to assure the futures of vulnerable children goes beyond the provision of proper physical shelter. In a country where illegal property grabbing is widespread, children frequently find themselves forced out of their homes, particularly in households headed by women. Through coordinated information and advocacy campaigning, we are working to increase community knowledge of inheritance and property rights and ensure that the homes of vulnerable children are not only safe and decent, but also secure.

We have already reached more than 25,000 people through posters, calendars, training, public service announcements and radio shows. With the help of trained paralegals, we are also working to ensure that legal rights can be properly enforced through registered wills and land ownership documentation.
